Biographical sketches of the apparent new members of Congress follow:

Dr. Francisco T. Palacios, senior medical officer at the Dr. Torres Hospital, was born in 1926 in Saipan. He received his medical training at the Naval Medical School in Guam and has had advanced training at Hilo Hospital in Hawaii and at the University of the Philippines. He is a member of the Mariana Islands District Legislature.

Dr. Carlos S. Camacho, medical officer at Dr. Torres Hospital, was born in 1937 in Garapan, Saipan. He graduated from the Central Medical School at Fiji in 1962.

David Ramarui, Palau District Educational Administrator, was born in Nghesar, Palau, in 1925. He received a B.A. degree in education and anthropology from the University of Hawaii in 1958. He has been active in the political life of Palau District for many years and served on the former Council of Micronesia.

Polycarp Basilius, was born in Nghesar, Palau, in 1936. He received his education at the College of Guam. He is a member of the Palau District Legislature. He is owner of a restaurant and runs a guide service for tourists.

Raymond Setik, Assistant District Administrator for Administration of Truk, was born in 1930 in Lukunor. He received his education at the Pacific Islands Teacher Training School. He served as a member of the Truk District Legislature from 1959-1963. He is presently a member of the Truk District Scholarship Committee and Board of Education.
