Public Law 89-10 is the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 which provides funds to develop special programs to meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged youth of the United States and outlying territories. Title I covers Federal assistance for the education of children from low-income families; Title II covers school library resources, textbooks and other instructional materials, and Title III covers supplementary education centers an services. During fiscal year 1967 the Trust Territory will receive grants under the three Titles amounting to approximately \$888,000.
