

TWO MICRONESIANS WIN SCHOLARSHIPS TO EWC

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands,

Apr. 12 . . . Scholarships to the East-West Center at the University of

Hawaii, Honolulu, have been awarded to two Trust Territory applicants

for 1967-68. Selected to work toward a bacheror's degree in arts and

sciences were Augustin Borja Camacho from Saipan, Mariana Islands, and

Mitchuo M. Timothy from Kusaie, Ponape. Jose Cepeda Guerrero from

Saipan was named as an alternate.

A maximum of five scholarships can be awarded to the Trust Territory by the Center. Including the cost of transportation to and from Hawaii (upon termination of studies), the scholarship pays the tuition, fees, and dormitory room cost. Also, \$150 is granted per month to cover food and incidental expenses. A small medical policy is furnished by the University for each scholarship winner.

In order to be admitted to the East-West Center, a person must meet the qualifications for admission to the University of Hawaii. The scholarship is renewable each year if the student is doing acceptable work according to the University's standards. Seven students from the Trust Territory are presently on such scholarships.

Winners are chosen from a list of 10-20 applications mailed to the Center by the Trust Territory's Department of Education. Each district of the Territory has a "scholarship committee" that receives
