

TWO POLICEMEN TO ATTEND INTERNATIONAL POLICE ACADEMY AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands,

May 2 . . . Deputy Sheriff Mariano C. Torres and Detective Lieutenant Gregorio S. Sablan, both members of the Marianas Police Force, left today on their way to the nation's capital for a four-month police training course. The first three months will be spent in a general police course while the final month will be devoted to specialization courses. Lieutenant Sablan's special area study will be in criminology and security investigation while Deputy Sheriff Torres' will be in police instruction methods. This training is a program of the Agency for International Development (AID) and is sponsored by the State Department. Arrangements for the course were made through correspondence by Mrs. Ruth G. Van Cleve, Director of the Office of Territories, and the Headquarters Legal Department with Mr. Michael G. McCann, Chief Director of the International Police Academy. The Academy, which

TRUST TERRITORY REMAINS ON STANDARD TIME

Saipan, Mariana Islands, Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, May 2 . . . The Trust Territory will not observe Public Law 29-327, the High Commissioner announced Saturday, April 29. This law, commonly known as "daylight saving time," advances U. S. time zones by one hour to increase the length of daylight during the working day.

In the past, it has been the policy of the Trust Territory Government to observe the same time standard as Guam to ensure uniformity in shipping and air transportation schedules. On April 28 the Government of Guam took legislative action to remain on Standard Time, resulting. in the High Commissioner rescinding a previous announcement that the Territory would observe PL 89-387.

All districts of the Trust Territory will remain on the present time zone schedule.
