State Department Leader Grant Tour of the United States, Acting Deputy
High Commissioner Robert K. Shoecraft announced today.

The two grantees are scheduled to depart Guam Tuesday, June 8, for New York where they will observe the meetings of the United Nations Trusteeship Council., While the State Department has not issued a final itinerary for them as yet, it is expected that they will spend several days observing activities in their specific fields of interest in addition to visiting various points in the United States.

Mr. Sablan was born in 1936 in Rota, Marianas District. He receive his education at Pacific Islands Central School. He has had a wide range of work experience ranging from manager of the Territory's former Community Store to his present position of Budget Analyst in the Head-quarters Budget and Finance Office.
