President Johnson has accepted the resignation of Mrs. Eugenie Anderson, of Red Wing, Minnesota, as Representative of the United States on the Trusteeship Council of the United Nations. She was appointed to this position on September 11, 1965.

Mrs. Anderson is also leaving the position of Special Assistant to the Secretary of State, a post to which she was appointed by the Secretary on April 15, 1968.

Other positions Mrs. Anderson has held are:

America's first woman Ambassador as U. S. Ambassador to Denmark, from 1949 to 1953.

First American woman to serve as Chief of Mission to an Eastern European country, having been U. S. Minister to Bulgaria from 1962 to 1965.

Alternate Representative of the U. S. to the 20th Session of the General Assembly of the UN in 1965.

Alternate Representative of the U. S. to the 21st Session of the General Assembly of the UN in 1966.

Representative of the U. S. to the 5th Special Session of the General Assembly of the UN in 1967.

Mrs. Anderson was born in Adair, Iowa, in May 1909. She is married to John Pierce Anderson, has two married children and six grandchildren.
