Dear Mr. Moose:

I received your letter of March 21, and was very pleased to learn that your office is actively reviewing the present status of the United States' relationship with its Trust Territory Islands of the Pacific.

For the last five years I have been diligently attempting to call the attention of the White House to the rapidly deteriorating relationship between US and Micronesia. I have recently received assistance in attempting to raise the national priority of this problem from people such as, Peter O'Donnell, Republician Chairman of Texas; Roy Goodearl, appointments secretary for Vice President Agnew, (a very old, personal friend of mine); Congressman George Bush, Republician Congressman from Texas, (ex-navy fighter pilot in the Pacific Campaignes) and several old friends of yours, George Christian and Loyd Hackler. It is essential that President Nixon take immediate steps to prevent a situation from developing in the Trust Territory similiar to the present awkward position in which Great Britain finds itself in dealing with the Caribbean Island of Anguilla. It is difficult to over look the similarity of the problems. Probably the main difference is that the problem of the Trust Territory covers three million square miles of the Pacific, and that this area maintains a position on the Trusteeship Counsel of the United Nations.

I have enclosed with this letter a recent House bill #8798 introduced by Congresswoman Patsy Mink. I believe that this organic act introduced by Mrs. Mink has many excellent features, however, it is very doubtful that any such bill originated by the Congress of the United States without direct consultation with the Congress of Micronesia would be properly received by the people of Micronesia.

I am also enclosing a recent newsletter from the American Society of Oceanography. The purpose of including this is to bring to your attention the importance of this area in relationship to the United States' oceanographic future. The article also mentions an old friend of mine from Palau, Peter Wilson, who is one of the few young aggressive and un-conventional American employees of the Trust Terrtory government.

I sincerely hope that you will not allow the Trust Territory priority to shrink and get lost in the maze of problems facing the new administration. The priority of Micronesia today is of the same order of magnitude as it was in 1944.
