Resolution No. 13

Introduced by Resolutions Committee

Relative to memorializing the Secretary
of the Interior to eliminate the Micronesian
Title and Pay Plan for government employees
of the government of the Trust Territory of

the Pacific Islands and to establish in lieu thereof a unified and uniform Civil Service System for employees of the government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

WHEREAS, the members of the government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands have a dual system of wage scale, known as the "Micronesian Title and Pay Plan"; and

WHEREAS, off-island employees performing the same work as local hire are receiving this level of wage scale and denying their counterpart; and

WHEREAS, this is purely discriminatory and inequitable in all respects considering the high cost of living in the Trust Territory and thus rendering the local hires less able to provide their families with the adequate necessities of life; and

WHEREAS, it is evidently conducive to a sharp departure from the accepted American standard of wages under our Democratic system of government; and

whereas, the elimination of such dual system would result in better relationship between the people of the Trust Territory and the people of the United States, by recognizing the principle of "Equal pay for equal work" now prevailing and considered highly Democratic; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Secretary of Interior, the Honorable Walter J. Hickel, is hereby memorialized to take effective necessary steps to remove the inequities existing hereof; and therefore be it further
