WASHINGTON-President Nixon, Tuesday named an extensed foreign service officer, James M. Wilson, Jr., U.S. deputy representative for Micronesian status negotiations.

The appointment, effective Nov. 1, follows the recess of the sixth round of Micronesian status talks in Honolulu. The recess repetited of each use receive of concern over the direction of the talks and the desire of the direction congress that the alternative of independence be explored.

In 'e event of a U.S. military withdrawal Guam and the Trust Territory Islands are seen as the United States military outpost in the Pacific.

Wilson, who will serve as the principal deputy of Ambassador Frankin Haydn Williams, the President's personal representative for the status talks replaces. Arthur Hummel Hummel, who was orginally serving in Burma was reassigned there in February and the post has been vacant since.

As deputy representative, Wilson will chair an inter-agency group working on Micronesia's status and will be in charge of preparing U.S. negotiating positions.

Wilson, 54, was born of American parents in Mokanshan.
