

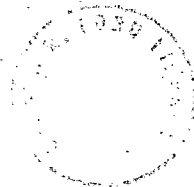

Nature of next Round of Talks

1. Informal on Carmel pattern rather than formal.
 - Need to pre-cook
 - JCFS clew on Titles II, IV and V.
 - Technical updating in draft Compact.
 - Need to agree on transition funding commitment.
 - Need to complete land negotiations before formal round is held.
2. Timing
 - Depends on timing of special session.
 - Early June?
 - July?
 - Role of Andon Amaraich .
 - U.S. flexible.
 - Post Marianas IV
 - Pre special session if early June.
 - Post special session if early June.
3. Place
 - Carmel / *Honolulu*
 - Truk/Yap/Koror.

What U.S. has been doing since Carmel

1. Clearing points of ad referendum agreement with principals in Washington.
 - a. New termination formula.
 - b. New 405 provisions on possible financial assistance during time levels after 15 years being negotiated.
2. Review of text of Compact for non-substantive changes.
3. Developing text to confirm officially levels of CIP and operational assistance during stages 1 and 2 of transition period.
4. Working with OMB to get authorization ceilings lifted for Stage 1.
5. Reporting results of Carmel talks to key leadership in U.S. Congressional committees.
6. Getting ready for Palau land surveys if they can come off soon.
