Marianas Homesteading

1. Some three weeks ago prior to going on leave
Mr. Wilson asked that the attached draft letter be sent to
the U.S. High Commissioner in the Trust Territory on the
subject of homesteading in the Marianas. The purpose was
to remove that subject as an issue in the current status
negotiations with the Marianas and to place the responsibility for the homesteading program squarely where it belongs
on the Trust Territory and District Governments.

2. I understand that on your return the following week you determined that it would be more appropriate to discuss the matter orally with Saipan and in fact called the Acting High Commissioner on the subject. I am now advised that the District Administrator, despite whatever instructions were given him by the Acting High Commissioner, has failed to take any further action on the subject and has stated orally that he intends to take none until requested to do so by local political figures. Meanwhile pressures on U.S. negotiators are increasing daily to do something about the situation.
