BACKGROUND:

1. The Congress has completed action on the Covenant and it will probably arrive at the White House Monday, March 15, or Tuesday, March 16. The President has ten days in which to sign the bill.

- 2. The Covenant was unanimously approved by the Marianas Legislature February 1975.
- 3. A Plebesite was conducted on June 17, 1975 where 95% of all eligible voters were registered and 95% of all registered voters voted. In the Plebesite 78.8% voted in favor of commonwealth status in a permanent union with the U.S.
- 4. There are 18 government and civic leaders from the Northern Marianas now in Washington anticipating a signing ceremony.
- 5. A signing ceremony and the obvious Presidential interest will be a boost to negotiations now under way with the rest of the Marianas territories.
