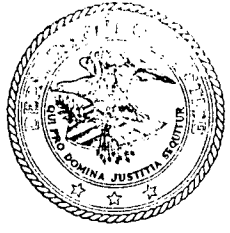

The President today announced his intention to nominate the following individuals to be United States Marshals:

EDWARD M. CAMACHO to be United States Marshal for the District of the Northern Mariana Islands for a term to expire September 14, 1986. Mr. Camacho will serve simultaneously as United States Marshal for the District of Guam. Mr. Camacho was a member of the Department of Public Safety, Agana, Guam, in 1949-1980. He retired as Aide to the Director. He resides in Leyang Barrigada, Guam. He was born January 30, 1925.

ROMOLO J. IMUNDI to be United States Marshal for the Southern District of New York for the term of four years. He would succeed George V. Grant. Since 1974, he has been an Investigator for the Veterans Administration, New York, New York. He was a member of the New York City Police Department in 1942-1974, retiring as a Detective First Grade. He resides in Bronx, New York. He was born August 18, 1918.
