#### A SENATE RESOLUTION

Requesting President Ronald Reagan to resolve the controversy regarding the issuance of U.S. passports to the citizens of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

WHEREAS, the people of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana 1 2 Islands, in a United Nations observed plebiscite, voted overwhelmingly to approve the Covenant To Establish A Commonwealth of the Northern 3 4 Mariana Islands In Political Union with the United States of America 5 (The "Covenant"); and WHEREAS, the Covenant was approved by the U.S. Congress and the 6 7 President of the United States resulting in the partial implementation 8 of United States Public Law 94-241 effective in January 1978; and 9 WHEREAS, on November 4, 1986, President Ronald Reagan issued a 10 Proclamation declaring the Covenant to be in full force and effect; and WHEREAS, the people of the Northern Marianas have waited many years 11 12 for this declaration and for the fulfillment of their dreams to become members of the American political family; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the U.S. Passport Team in Saipan, based on the U.S. State Department's interpretation of the Covenant and the U.S. laws, require 15 that both parents of a child born in the Northern Mariana Islands must 16 17 have been citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands ("T.T. citizens") in order for their children to be eligible for U.S. passports; 18



- WHEREAS, the additional requirements imposed by the U.S. Passport 1 Team to account for the periods of residency in the Northern Marianas of 2 those T.T. citizens who are applying for U.S. passports impose an 3 unnecessary, costly and time consuming process for these applicants; and 4 5 WHEREAS, such determination does not take into account the unique. historical aspects that led to the creation of the U.S. Commonwealth of 6 the Northern Mariana Islands from part of the Trust Territory of the 7 Pacific Islands, a former League of Nations mandate under Japan prior to 8 9 World War II; and WHEREAS, the applications of many T.T. citizens who have one parent 10 of foreign ancestry have been denied by the U.S. Passport Team; and 11 WHEREAS, a child who was born in the Northern Marianas whose father 12 is a T.T. citizen and whose mother is a U.S. citizen might be denied a 13 14 U.S. passport; and WHEREAS, a child who was born in a U.S. Army Hospital in West 15 Germany whose parents are both T.T. citizens and whose father was a 16 former member of the United States Army will be denied a U.S. passport; 17 18 and WHEREAS, these T.T. citizens have complied with the requirements of 19 Article III of the Covenant and have been domiciled in the Northern 20

    based on the United States Public Law 98-213, which defined "a citizen of

    the Northern Mariana Islands" to mean <u>"a citizen of the Trust Territory</u>

    who does not owe allegiance to any foreign state and who was born in the

         WHEREAS, the intent of the Covenant is very clear and unambiguous

    and that U.S. Public Law 98-213 clearly shows that the United States

     Congress intended that only one parent be required to be a T.T. citizen

    in order for his or her children to become U.S. citizens; and

          WHEREAS, it is unfair that a child who was born between the time

     the Covenant was signed and November 4, 1986, is not a U.S. citizen but

     if he or she was born after November 4, 1986 of the same parents, he or

          WHEREAS, it is also unfair that an illegal alien who crosses the
